1. Call to Order

Cha irman Jensen called the meeting to order at 1:00 P. M.

2. Ro II Call

The roll was called and the results are outlined above.

3. Approval of the December 2015 Meeting Minutes

Secretary Kaiser made a motion to dispense with the read in g of the January 13, 2016 meeting minutes and accept them as recei ved. Vice Chair Mullins seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimous ly.

4. Public to be Heard

Hans Wilson stated that he att ended the FSBPA's technical conference and it was a very good presentation.

5. Financial Report

a) Budget Performane Ending January 31, 2016.

Treasurer Walter reviewed the financial report.

6. Old Business

a) Redfish Pass Study

Chairman Jensen reported that the field work has been wrapped up. Chairman Jensen asked Ms. Rooker if she knew the approximate date of completio n. Ms. Rooker replied and said completio n should be in Octob er. Ms. Rook er stated that they are trying to coordinate the Redfish Pass Study wit h the Blind Pass Study. The gauges were out for over a m ont h and they were able to ret rieve them. Right now they are processing all of this dat a. All of the calibrations and modeling have been set up.

b) Blind Pass Study

Ms. Rooke r stated the tide gauges were retrieved on January 13th. At the Coastal Advisory Council Meeting (CAC) Steve Boutelle gave an update on the study. All of t he field work went well and the data they retrieved from the gauges is lookin g solid. The next event is a Technical Advisory Committee meeting. Following that will be one or two community stake holders meetings with

Sanibel and Capti va. Secretary Kaiser asked Ms. Rooker when they would be having these meetings. Ms. Rooker stat ed that the meetings shoul d be before April.

Commissioner Mullins asked if there is a new interlocal agreement with Sanibel. Ms. Rooker stated that CEPD will need the result s from the study before a new agreement is negotiated.

7. New Business

a) Response to Fish Kills

Ms. Rooker stated t hat Captiva has not had any fish killed by the red tide. She spoke to Florida Fish and Wildlife (FWC), Lee county Natural Resources & Parks & Rec. about cleaning up a fish kill. FWC will givesome direction on fish kills should one be reported. Secretary Kaiser asked what would be done about the cleanup. Ms. Rooker stated that there are no rules regarding clean up. Anyone can pick up a fi sh and throw it in the garbage. If it's a large fish kill, the fish can be buried as well. Vice Chair Mullins made a motion to establish a viable pro cedure for Lee County to help with a fish kill. Seconded by Secretary Kaiser. The motion carri ed unanimously.

8) Administrator Report

a) FEMA Update

Ms. Rooker referred the Board to a lett er from the Atlanta office of FEMA. FEMA has loo ked at CEPD's project worksheet and it's been approved for their environment al review. FEMA has the Federal as well as the State biological opinion. At this time FEMA officials will review the project worksheet and make a determination.

Secretary Kaiser was curious as to how much money CEPD requested from FEMA. Ms. Rooker replied and said \$1.8 million was requested. If CEPD is not satisfied with FEMA's decision, CEPD has the right to appeal that decision.

b) Coastal Advisory Council Meeting of 2/8/16

Ms. Rooker stated that she we nt to the CAC meeting on Monday. Ms. Rooker gave the Commissioners the agenda and fut ure meet ing dates.

Ms. Rooker stated that Steve Boutelle had a lot to share. He spoke about the Blind Pass Study and said the maintenance is going to occur on Blind Pass by the end of 2016. Lee County has applied to the state for state money for Pass maint enance and the inlet management plan.

After seeing recent areal views of the beaches presented by Steve Bout elle, Ms. Roo ker could see how well the beaches that have been nourished are holding up following several significant weat her events in January. Ms. Roo ker asked Steve Boute IIe and Natural Re courses staff if they would present that information to the Lee County Board of County Commissioners (LCB@C) to demonstrate to County Commissioners how the beaches protect infrastructure and homes.

Chairman Jensen asked Ms. Rooker to briefly remind the Board members of what CEPD is expectin g from the Tourist Development Council (TDC). Ms. Rook er reported that CEPD's grant request is due on February 25, 2016. The grant is to help maintain the Hagerup beach access.

Vice Chair Mullin's commented on the cost share with Lee County. He would like to see if CEPD is entitled to more funding from the County.

c) William Stro nge, Ph.D. Presentation of 3/9/16

Ms. Rooker wanted to remind the Board of the presentation on 3-9-16 from Dr. William Strange. He will explain the methodology for apportionment and assessments. Ms. Rook er stated this would be a good presentation for Captiva's new Commissioners.

d) Debbie Flack - FSBPA Report

Ms. Rooker referred the Board to Debbie Flack's report. The State is currently working on the budget. Ms. Rooker stated the problem with the state budget is that there is no dedicated funding source for beaches in the State of Florida. In the past, doc stamps from real estate sales were dedicated to beach funding. Upon the implementation of Amendment 1 this was no longer the case. We are now in the second year of Amendment 1 and wit hout reoccurring funding for beaches. Every environmental group in the State of Florida is competing for Amendment 1 trust funds. It has become very competit ive.

Ms. Rooker is hoping the FSBPA lobbyist in Tallahassee can make the State understand that our beaches do need more funding and it needs to be dedicated reoccurring funding. In addition to the reoccurring money, beaches will require non-reoccurring general revenue funds, which means the State will take from its own general revenue to supplement beaches.

e) Army Corps

Ms. Ro oker has been in touch with Jackie Kaiser with the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE). Ms. Rooker has asked if she or another representative from the Corps could come to one of CEPD's meetings to talk about Federal participation. Ms. Rooker asked Ms. Kaiser to present an example of a proper easement and also the calculations of the cost share the Federal Government will provide if CEPD can show these easements.

Ms. Rooker has given Jackie Kaiser CEPD's Board meeting dates. Ms. Kaiser stated they are pleased to come and will let Ms. Rooker know which meeting date they can attend.

f) Welcome to Captiva Sign

Ms. Rooker reported that CEPD's maintenance man will clean the sign once every mont h. Commissione rs reported that the sign looked clean.
