Blind Pass Status Concerns CEPD

Crossing over the bridge at Blind Pass one can't help observing the significant shoaling within the Pass since construction to open the Pass was completed by the Lee County Division of Natural Resources in December 2009. Each week it appears the amount of sand shoaled into the restoration template grows (along with the concerns of local residents and the CEPD).

In October, with financial and CEPD Board support from Captiva, Lee County applied for a permit modification from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection

in order to expedite re-dredging and manage shoreline and inlet stability. The modifications stem from situations encountered during the initial construction and were developed to aid in obtaining the original design goals. Specifically, the permit is needed to:

- remedy sediment infilling
- correct the lack of a hydraulic channel sufficient to meet the original design intent
- correct the flow area that was lost through the settlement agreement negotiated by Lee County to avoid a property ownership dispute that narrowed the dredge template by 20%
- authorize a maintenance-dredge prior to the current 5 -year schedule.

With the help of physical monitoring, surveys and hydraulic measurements, engineers can examine the overall volumetric changes within the dredge template. Using this information, the rate of Pass infilling can be calculated. According to Robert Neal of the Lee County Division of Natural Resources, staff just pulled measuring instruments out of the water and a report will be available by late January or early February. It will contain data on volumetric shifts, shoreline movements, current velocities and tidal ranges. This data will be compared to the same data compiled when the Pass first was reopened. The quantitative measurements will be used to evaluate the performance of the Pass and determine the need for adjustments and modification to the project.

CEPD will report the results and any additional action to be taken by Lee County as soon as the monitoring report is available.




